## Millbrook at Home - a new model for aging

Some of us may have seen FRONTLINE's report on renowned New Yorker writer and Boston surgeon Atul Gawande as he explores the relationships doctors have with patients who are nearing the end of life. In conjunction with his new book, **Being Mortal**, the film explores how the medical profession can better help people navigate the final chapters of their lives with confidence, direction and purpose. Locally, **Rhinebeck at Home**, following this model, is committed to helping neighbors helping neighbors stay at home. Our local clergy network wants to explore how this model might help the Millbrook community. There will be a panel meeting on Thursday September 7 at Grace Church in Millbrook. It will begin with some wine and cheese at 6:00pm and the panel presentation will be from 6:30-8:00pm with local leaders who are involved with senior care issues. We will hear from Nina Lynch and Anne Brueckner, leaders in the Rhinebeck at Home program. They will also be inviting our community on September 25 to watch their national annual meeting of the movement via teleconference with Atul Gawande as the keynote speaker.

**Neighbors Helping Neighbors Stay Independent at Home:** Rhinebeck at Home is dedicated to helping our members remain in their homes and stay connected within the community as they grow older.

Dear friends in the Lord:

Next week our archdiocese takes up a collection for the *Catholic Home Missions Appeal* and the *Church in Latin America*. The Appeal supports the (arch)dioceses here in our own country that struggle to make ends meet and to serve all the needs of their parishioners. With your contributions to the *Catholic Home Missions Appeal*, the diocese reaches out to some of the most marginalized people — those in prison. Many detainees are returning to the Catholic faith and are in need of the Lord's mercy. Your gifts provide liturgical and educational supplies, help priests offer the Eucharist and other sacraments, and support volunteers' and ministers' outreach to more than 10,000 men and women in detention facilities. Your generosity brings Christ's message of love, compassion, and reconciliation to this often forgotten population.

For more than a half century, the collection for the *Church in Latin America* has been a sign of the solidarity of the Church in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support helps to share the faith with those who long to experience the Lord's mercy within strong faith communities. For example, in northern Peru, great distances and deteriorated roads mean that Church agents must often travel by foot or mule to rural communities. As a result, some communities are visited by pastoral agents and ministers only once per month, others sometimes just twice per year. This collection for the *Church in Latin America* was able to help fund training for 65 pastoral ministers for the communities of this region. Thanks to your support, these new leaders continue to reach out in service to rural communities, ensuring that all feel included in our family of faith.

Your support of this combined collection makes a difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters right here in the United States as well as families in Latin America and the Caribbean.
